(1947 - 2013)

Marek Pertkiewicz was born in 1947 and completed his medical studies in 1971. He worked in the Department of General and Gastrointestinal Surgery of Warsaw Medical University until year 2003 when he established there his own Department of Surgery and Nutrition. Marek was with ESPEN from its inception. His first formal activity in ESPEN was the ESPEN Basic Course, held annually in the "Eastern countries" starting in 1989, on a rotational basis in Hungary, Czechoslovakia, Croatia and Poland.

In Poland he was the driving force of the Polish Society for Parenteral and Enteral Nutrition for decades, he created together with his colleagues. For many years he was President of the Society. He was also a member of the Polish Academy of Sciences, and clearly had a major influence on the education of Polish doctors in all aspects of malnutrition. Marek Pertkiewicz was a doyen in the field of clinical nutrition and a very important person with a huge impact and immense contribution in the founding of the ACCN. He was supporting all of us from the very beginning of Adriatic Club and was a great teacher and friend of the ACCN.









Prof. Herbert Lochs (1946 - 2015)

Herbert Lochs was involved in ESPEN activities for many years and was appointed as ESPEN Honorary member regarding his outstanding involvement in ESPEN and the field of Clinical Nutrition. He was a global leading expert in IBD, gastrointestinal oncology, hepatology and nutrition. Besides remarkable publications in the field of Clinical Nutrition and Gastroenterology he greatly participated in publishing od German and ESPEN Guidelines.

From 1994 to 2009 he was Director of the Department of Gastroenterology and Hepatology in the prestigious Charité Hospital in Berlin. From 2009-13 he was the Rector of the Faculty of Medicine in Innsbruck. Herbert Lochs was worlwide recognized as an excellent lecturer and teacher. His contribution for ESPEN was exceptionnal.

Herbert with his smile, friendship and unlimited skills and knowledge supported the Croatian Society of Clinical Nutrition from the very beginning.









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
